Upcoming Deadlines

Opportunity: Kids Gardening -- 2025 Youth Garden Grant

Due Date: December 13, 2024

Eligible Applicants: Schools and youth organizations planning a new garden or expanding an established one for at least 15 youth between ages 0-18

Purpose: The Youth Garden Grant has supported school and youth educational garden projects that enhance the quality of life for students and their communities.

Estimated Range of Awards: 50 programs will receive award packages consisting of a \$500 cash prize. Some winners will also receive a Crescent container gardening package.

<u>Opportunity: FMFCU Foundation Excellence in Teaching</u> <u>Awards</u>

Due Date: December 20, 2024

Eligibility: Nominees must be PA certified K-12 teachers

Purpose: The Delaware Valley Excellence in Teaching Awards, presented by FMFCU Foundation, recognizes 20 outstanding and dedicated teachers the Philadelphia region. Local teachers can be nominated to receive \$1,000 grants towards educational expenses and \$1,000 for their school.

Nominations can be submitted by students, parents, co-workers or supervisors.

Estimated Range of Awards: awards up to \$2,000

Opportunity: Bonnie Plants 3rd Grade Cabbage Program

Due Date: January 15, 2025

Eligibility: 3rd grade teachers

Purpose: This program offers free cabbages to students in the 3rd grade. The mission is to inspire a love of vegetable gardening in young people, teach kids where their food comes from, and grow our next generation of gardeners. At the end of the season, teachers from each 3rd grade participating class select the student who has grown the "best" cabbage, based on size and appearance. The program then awards a \$1,000 scholarship to one student in each participating state.

Opportunity: ACS-Hach Professional Development Grant

Due Date: January 21, 2025

Eligibility: High school chemistry educators

Purpose: The American Chemical Society (ACS) requests applications for the ACSHach Professional Development Grant program. Funding supports high school chemistry teachers as they identify and pursue opportunities that advance their professional development and enhance the teaching and learning of chemistry in their classrooms.

Estimated Range of Awards: Up to \$2,500

<u>Opportunity: Karma for Cara Community Service</u> <u>Youth MicroGrant Program</u>

Due Date: January 1st, April 1st, July 1st, & October 1st

Eligible Applicants: Students 18 years of age and under. Must have a teacher/adult advisor for their project.

Purpose: Students may apply to complete service projects in their communities throughout the United States.

Estimated Range of Awards: between \$250-\$1,000

Note: They do not fund stipends, facility rentals, or transportation costs.

Opportunity: Leveling the Playing Field

Due Date: Rolling Basis

Eligible Applicants: K-12 schools and nonprofits serving economically disadvantaged youth

Purpose: Leveling the Playing Field furnishes schools and community organizations with free new and gently-used sports equipment enabling those groups to provide affordable and accessible youth sports activities for their children who otherwise would not have such opportunities.

Estimated Range of Awards: Access to their warehouse space to take new and gently-used equipment on a continuous basis

Opportunity: Lovett Fund for Elementary Drama

Due Date: Rolling basis, beginning in August of each school year

Eligible Applicants: Elementary Educators, 501c3s

Purpose: Funding is available for the production of plays and musicals performed by elementary school students (grades 1–5) in a school program.

Estimated Range of Awards: \$300

Opportunity: Toshiba America Foundation

Due Date: Ongoing

Eligible Applicants: Teachers of grades K-12

Purpose: Toshiba America Foundation (TAF) grants fund the projects ideas and materials teachers need to innovate in their science, technology, engineering and math classrooms. TAF is interested in funding innovative projects designed by teachers or small teams of teachers for use in their own schools and classroom. Applications must be for project based learning.

They do not consider requests for computer hardware (including computers, laptops, and tablets). Summer programs, after-school projects, and independent study projects are not eligible for funding.

Estimated Range of Awards: GRADES K-5 Applications for less than \$5,000 are due 10/1.

GRADES 6-12

Applications for less than \$5,000 are due 12/1, 3/1, 6/1, & 9/1 Applications for grants of more than \$5,000 are due 11/1 and 5/1.
