Grant Opportunities

Please be sure to carefully review the funder's policies and practices before beginning any application and reach out to OGD with any changes you find.

Upcoming Deadlines

Opportunity: McCarthy Dressman Education Fundation

Due Date: Application is open January 15 until April 15 *OR before they reach 350 application submissions*.

Eligible Applicants: K-12 teachers

Purpose: The Foundation provides both academic enrichment grants and teacher development grants. The Foundation sponsors proposals that enhance student learning and educational quality, paying particular attention to those that best serve the at-risk and under-funded, including: curriculum that excites and challenges; inquiry projects that promote reflection and growth; and after-school programs that enrich and inspire. The Foundation partners with individuals to expand educational opportunities for America's youth that inspire students by nurturing their curiosity about the world and their place in it.

Estimated Range of Awards: Up to \$10,000 for a maximum budget of \$20,000 over 2 years

Opportunity: BioLEAP Classroom Grant

Due Date: February 28, 2025

Eligible Applicants: Teachers & School Administrators

Purpose: The BioLEAP Classroom Grant is designed to help educators fund the use of humane anatomy models in their classrooms to replace animal dissection. Awards are for the purchase of advanced learning tools such as 3D digital models, synthetic specimens, and other innovative products.

Estimated Range of Awards: 25-30 grants of up to \$1,000

Opportunity: Whole Kids Foundation Garden Grant Program

Due Date: March 5, 2025

Eligibility: K–12 Schools or Non-Profit Organizations in U.S./Canada that engage at least 10 students in the garden regularly

Purpose: The Garden Grant program supports new or existing edible educational gardens located at K–12 Schools in the U.S. or Canada. The aim is for schools to turn outdoor spaces into powerful hands-on learning gardens that connect kids with food, spark their curiosity and support classroom curriculum. Whole Kids prioritizes awarding applicants encountering barriers to accessing healthy food and nutrition education resources and opportunities, including situations of acute crisis.

*Each garden project must have the participation of a partner organization from the community that will help to bring long-term sustainability to the initiatives. Examples include a local non-profit, a local farm, a hardware or garden store, a garden club, or a restaurant. Please note: a school's PTA/PTO does not qualify as a community partner.

Estimated Range of Awards: \$3,500

Opportunity: Dollar General Youth Literacy Grants

Due Date: OPENS March 6th. DUE April 3rd.

Eligibility: Schools and nonprofit organizations who help students who are below grade level or having trouble reading are eligible to apply. Must be located within a state that Dollar General Corporation operates in and that is within 15 miles of a Dollar General store.

Purpose: Grant funding is provided to assist in the following areas: implementing new or expanding existing literacy programs; purchasing new technology or equipment to support literacy initiatives; and purchasing books, materials or software for literacy programs.

Estimated Range of Awards: \$1,000-\$4,000

<u>Opportunity: Karma for Cara Community Service</u> <u>Youth MicroGrant Program</u>

Due Date: April 1st, July 1st, October 1st, & January 1st

Eligible Applicants: Students 18 years of age and under. Must have a teacher/adult advisor for their project.

Purpose: Students may apply to complete service projects in their communities throughout the United States.

Estimated Range of Awards: between \$250-\$1,000

Note: They do not fund stipends, facility rentals, or transportation costs.

Opportunity: Leveling the Playing Field

Due Date: Rolling Basis

Eligible Applicants: K-12 schools and nonprofits serving economically disadvantaged youth

Purpose: Leveling the Playing Field furnishes schools and community organizations with free new and gently-used sports equipment enabling those groups to provide affordable and accessible youth sports activities for their children who otherwise would not have such opportunities.

Estimated Range of Awards: Access to their warehouse space to take new and gently-used equipment on a continuous basis

Opportunity: Lovett Fund for Elementary Drama

Due Date: Rolling basis, beginning in August of each school year

Eligible Applicants: Elementary Educators, 501c3s

Purpose: Funding is available for the production of plays and musicals performed by elementary school students (grades 1–5) in a school program.

Estimated Range of Awards: \$300

Due Date: Ongoing

Eligibility: Must be located in West Phila, South Phila, or Center City

Purpose: Free Library Book Bikes provide mobile outreach services to schools, to community organizations, and at events throughout the city.

Eligible Applicants: K-12 educators

Purpose: The Philadelphia Zoo has a number of free programs that are available to School District of Philadelphia teachers and students.

1) Live Monthly Webinars- Invites many K-12 students and classes (even from different schools!) to a 45-minute storytelling session with Zoo educators and animal guests! Webinars are held at 10:30am once per month, each on a different topic. Sign up <u>Here</u>.

Opportunity: The Awesome Foundation

Due Date: Ongoing - every other month on the second Tuesday

Eligible Applicants: Anyone

Purpose: To support anyone working on a project to improve their community in Philadelphia

Estimated Range of Awards: \$1000

Opportunity: Toshiba America Foundation

Due Date: Ongoing

Eligible Applicants: Teachers of grades K-12

Purpose: Toshiba America Foundation (TAF) grants fund the projects ideas and materials teachers need to innovate in their science, technology, engineering and math classrooms. TAF is interested in funding innovative projects designed by teachers or small teams of teachers for use in their own schools and classroom. Applications must be for project based learning.

They do not consider requests for computer hardware (including computers, laptops, and tablets). Summer programs, after-school projects, and independent study projects are not eligible for funding.

Estimated Range of Awards: GRADES K-5 Applications for less than \$5,000 are due 10/1.

GRADES 6-12

Applications for less than \$5,000 are due 3/1, 6/1, 9/1, & 12/1 Applications for grants of more than \$5,000 are due 5/1 and 11/1.
